## Scottish Baha'i Summer School 2013: Registration & Information Pack

The Bahá'i Council for Scotland is delighted to invite you to the Summer school to be held in Kilgraston School, near Perth from Monday 15 July to Friday 19 July 2013.

#### **Directions**

#### Kilgraston School, Bridge of Earn, Perthshire, PH2 9BQ www.kilgraston.com

The school is about an hour by road from Glasgow or Edinburgh, and 7 miles south of Perth.

<u>From Edinburgh and the South</u>, follow the Forth Road Bridge and M90 towards Perth. Exit at Junction 9 for Bridge of Earn, turning left off the motorway. After several hundred metres, turn left at the mini-roundabout (following signs to Kilgraston School), and then after a few hundred metres turn right as directed by the signs.

<u>From Glasgow and the West</u>, follow A80, M80 to Stirling and then M9 and A9 to Perth. At the Broxden Roundabout by Perth, turn right following Edinburgh M90 until the exit at Junction 9 for Bridge of Earn. Turn right off motorway towards Bridge of Earn and Perth. After several hundred metres, turn left at the mini-roundabout (following signs to Kilgraston School), and then after few hundred metres, turn right as directed by the signs.

<u>From Inverness and the North</u> follow the A9 to Perth. At the Broxden Roundabout, follow the above instructions from Glasgow.

Public Transport from Perth: Buses to Kilgraston (Nos: 35, 36 and 56) stop near the school gates.

#### **School Timing**

The Summer school will open for registration from 11 a.m. on Monday 15 July 2013. Please do not arrive at the school any earlier, as the committee will be busy making final preparations at the venue. The programme will start at 2pm. The school will finish by 2pm on Friday 19 July 2013.

#### **Participants**

Those who wish to attend the school should register early, under one of the following categories:

**Residents (R):** Those who are staying in the residential houses for the full school period, attending the sessions and being provided with three meals a day.

**Non-resident Day Visitors (D):** Those who live nearby or are providing their own accommodation, but otherwise attending the school like residents, attending sessions and being provided with 2 meals a day.

#### **Accommodation**

On the Booking Form, please indicate whether you are a Resident (R), or a Non-resident Day-Visitor (D). (The format of the school, with its ongoing courses, does not lend itself to occasional attendance, but it may sometimes be possible to accommodate this - Please contact the registrar to discuss.)

Rooms will be allocated by the committee on a 'first come, first served' basis and with consideration of the physical needs of participants, where possible. There are 120 single private rooms with sinks (there are no 'en suite' rooms). Families will be located together, and other corridors will be 'single sex' due to some limitations with the bathroom facilities.

If you wish your room to be near anyone specific, please add this information to your booking form under "Special Requirements". We may not be able to consider this request if it is given later.

#### **Payment**

Your booking is only reserved when the Booking Form <u>and</u> the deposit are received. You may pay in full now, OR pay a £50 deposit per person (aged 11+) now and the **balance** by the **15 June**. Payment can be made by **cheque**, make payable to the **NSA of the Bahá'ís of the UK**. Unfortunately, we are unable to accept post-dated cheques.

**Credit card** payments can be made via the **NSA website** directly to <u>www.bahai.org.uk/donations</u> and please ensure you enter **Scottish Summer School 2013** in the 'Earmark' section. Please forward '**Transaction Confirmation**' **email** to the Registrar so that your receipt can be issued.

When your form and payment are received (see below for address of registrar) a confirmation of your booking will be sent to you by e-mail or post. All further information including course choices, programmes, details of arrivals etc. will be sent by e-mail or post. Please contact the Registrar if you do not receive this information 10 days before the start of the school.

#### **Unaccompanied Young People**

Young people under the age of 18 can attend the school without a parent. However, we require another adult (over 25) attending the school on the days when the young person is attending, to act as his/her Temporary Guardian at the school. This Temporary Guardian will take first responsibility for the young person's safety and behaviour.

For the length of the school, the Temporary Guardian acts as the parent for the young person, ensuring they are safe & healthy, & also that their behaviour is consistent with the Code of Conduct included in this booking pack - This must be read, discussed with an adult, & signed by all aged of eleven & above. The responsibilities and qualifications of the Temporary Guardian are included in the
